**Write an email to the organiser to describe an activity and explain why it is a good choice.**

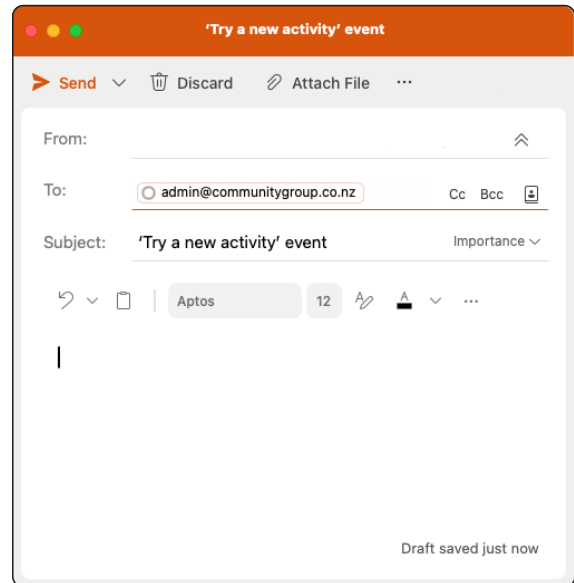

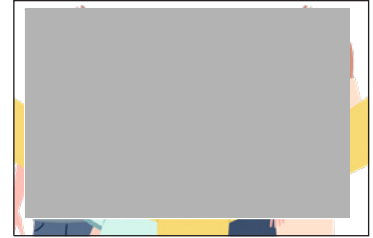
